Agenda Item: 01: The Action Taken Report of 21st meeting of IQAC held on 13-02-23 was approved.

The actions taken report of the 21st meeting was presented by IQAC Coordinator and following actions were taken.

- AQAR 2021-22 query received from NAAC resolved, resubmitted and accepted by NAAC
- Course outcome, program outcome and mapping of COs and POs are aligned as per revised syllabus of GGSIP university.
- The choice based credit system with electives course adopted by BBA and MBA department.
- Every department has started organizing lecture on ethics, gender awareness, environment and sustainability, human values and maintained detail of the student with the department.
- Head of the departments have started maintaining the records of a courses done by the students under Swayam/MOOCs/NTPL and e-pathshala in-case of MBA students.
- Faculty members have started giving case study and assignments in BBA and 2 case studies mandatories in MBA department.

Agenda Item :02: To discuss NEP and its alignment with Industry.

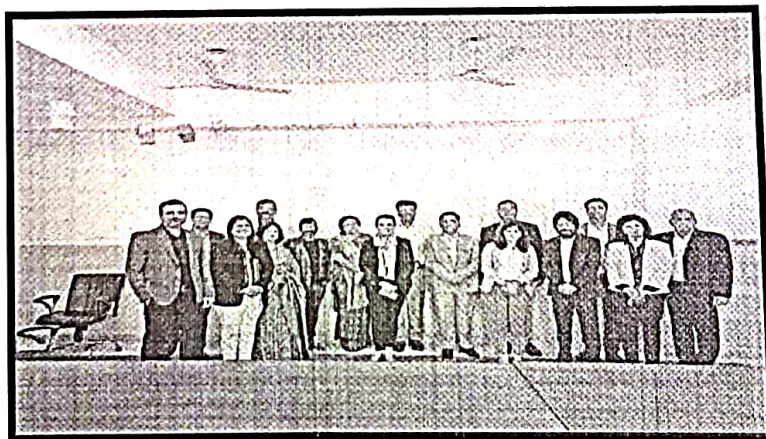
- IQAC in Collaboration with the Internware- The Internship cell of IITM, Janakpuri, organized a meeting with respect to curriculum alignment to NEP and Feedback on NEP.
- The Chairperson, Prof. (Dr.) Rachita Rana, Director, IITM, Janakpuri discussed how the industry is responding to NEP and its successful implementation.

- Interplay of Technology & Education with emphasis on online courses, blended/ hybrid learning, virtual learning.

Agenda Item :03: Meeting with Employers (Industry Experts) and take their feedback on NEP.

Following are the feedbacks from the Employers (Industry Experts):

- Mr. Alok Tiwari who explained that any country drafting any education policy should focus on three aspects for it to scale wide: Max literate population, least no. of dropouts, and instilling enough skillset.
- Mr. Ashok Sangwan stated that industry is responding to the NEP but Institute should focus on their mental health and give skilling on basic conceptual intake and upskill beyond curriculum as per Industry requirements.
- Mr. Jasmeet Singh elucidated that the Internship and real time experience will help in skilling and positive feedback.
- Ms. Meenu Chopra emphasized the Institute should encourage certification courses.
- Mr. Nilanjan Mukherjee shared that the Institute should adopt Quality Framework and vocational training beyond curriculum in order to increase the scope of employability.
- Mr. Saurabh Gandhi expressed how the NEP aims to transform the entire education system with the learner in focus. It should adopt the philosophy Learn, Relearn and Unlearn.
- Mr. Vinood Sharma gave an excellent point that the Colleges are taking initiative to make students corporate-ready, the adoption of NEP should be accepted by students. Human values and Ethics should be instill in students through activities and workshop.
